





On behalf of MCSA, I oversaw the Threat Review Prioritization Project through MCSA Intelligence Commanders Group in partnership with Major City Chiefs Association. Both MCSA and MCCA Intel Commanders collaborated to identify, mitigate, and prevent threats to our communities. The results were presented at the 2019 Joint MCCA/MCSA Conference and the MCSA Summer Conference.

I will continue to provide Sheriffs' viewpoints and policies regarding complex and challenging issues we face in law enforcement daily when requested by the Executive Administration or MCSA.

Due to Loudoun County's close proximity to the Washington, DC regional area, my availability to attend roundtables or committee meetings – with minimal notification – provides an additional benefit for MCSA. When I initially announced my intent, I conveyed that my connections, proximity to DC, and possessing an active Top Secret/SCI Clearance, provides me a unique access to sensitive and intelligence information not available to most law enforcement officials.

Our agency has dedicated resources allocated to the Drug Enforcement Administration Diversion Task Force, FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force, FBI Domestic Terrorism Task Force, FBI WFO Child Exploitation and Human Trafficking Task Force, FBI Washington DC Metro Safe Streets Task Force, United States Secret Service National Capital Regional Cyber Fraud Task Force, Washington Baltimore/High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area, Virginia State Police Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, and the Northern Virginia Gang Task Force. This requires continual meetings with the FBI Washington Field Office Assistant Director in Charge, Acting Special Agents in Charge, as well as with the DEA Assistant Special Agent in Charge. As a result, our assistance and collaboration has contributed to many apprehensions and seizures. Most notably, a LCSO detective assigned to the DEA HIDTA task force lead an investigation involving Mexican Cartels, the murder of a US Task Force Agent, spanned seven states, and resulted in multi-kilogram seizures of heroin, cocaine, and fentanyl, along with numerous assault weapons.

In addition, our agency has a solid, professional reputation. The LCSO has received national and state recognition for our initiatives, programs, and employee achievements. Some recent noteworthy departmental accomplishments include:

- LCSO received 100% Accreditation from Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission – March 2021
- LCSO recognized for lowest crime rate in Northern Virginia and in the 24 Metropolitan Council of Governments (MWCOG) MD, VA & DC regional law enforcement agencies.
- LCSO participated in White House HHS Policing mental health report as a part of the President's Executive Order on Safe Policing in Safe Communities Rollout Conference Call – December 2020
- LCSO recognized by the Department of Justice Western District of New York for its investigation and apprehension of a Newark, NJ individual charged with multiple counts of child pornography – July 2020
- LCSO ADC awarded grant through the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to initiate a Medication-Assisted Treatment Program (MAT) for opioid use disorder for inmates in conjunction with Loudoun County Mental Health.
- LCSO ADC selected in conjunction with CNA, Institute for Public Research and The National Institute of Justice to conduct research study to test the effectiveness of Body Worn Cameras (BWCs) in a correctional setting. This was the first study done with BWC's in a correctional facility.
- LCSO ADC received a 100% on the Compliance Audit from the Virginia Department of Corrections – June 2020
- Loudoun County Public Schools-Business Partnership Executive Council Legacy Award 2019
- LCSO School Resource Officer Unit received the Model Agency of the Year Award from the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) - 2018
- LCSO received the 2018 Achievement Award from the Virginia Association of Counties recognizing the Small Unmanned Aircraft System (sUAS) as a Model Local Government Program - 2018

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MEET THE SPEAKERS

THE HONORABLE CHRISTOPHER WRAY

DIRECTOR Federal Bureau of Investigation

Christopher Wray became the eighth Director of the FBI on August 2, 2017. Mr. Wray began his law enforcement career in 1997, serving in the Department of Justice as an assistant U.S. attorney for the Northern District of Georgia. In that role, Mr. Wray prosecuted a wide variety of federal criminal cases, including public corruption, guntrafficking, drug offenses, and financial

fraud. In 2001, Mr. Wray was named associate deputy attorney general, and then principal associate deputy attorney general, in the Office of the Deputy Attorney General in Washington, D.C. His duties there spanned the full Department of Justice (DOJ), including responsibility for sensitive investigations conducted by the Department's law enforcement agencies. Mr. Wray was nominated by President George W. Bush in 2003 to be the assistant attorney general for DOJ's Criminal Division, supervising major national and international criminal investigations and prosecutions. He also oversaw



the Counterterrorism Section and the Counterintelligence and Export Control Section, which were part of the Criminal Division throughout his tenure (DOJ later consolidated those sections into the National Security Division). Mr. Wray was a member of the President's Corporate Fraud Task Force, supervised the Enron Task Force, and served as a leader in DOJ's post-9/11 efforts to combat terrorism, espionage, and cybercrime with domestic and foreign government partners. At the conclusion of his tenure, Mr. Wray was awarded the Edmund J. Randolph Award, DOJ's highest award for leadership and public service. Mr. Wray was born in New

York City. He graduated with a bachelor's degree from Yale University in 1989 and earned his law degree from Yale Law School in 1992. He clerked for Judge J. Michael Luttig of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. In 1993, Mr. Wray joined the international law firm of King & Spalding LLP, where he spent a total of almost 17 years practicing law in the area of government investigations and white collar crime. At the time of his nomination to be FBI Director, Mr. Wray was Chair of the firm's Special Matters and Government Investigations Practice Group.

THE HONORABLE **TROY NEHLS**

Congressman **TEXAS - 22**

Congressman Nehls Trov proudly represents the 22ndCongressional District of Texas in the U.S. House of Representatives. Texas' 22nd Congressional District includes portions of Fort Bend, Brazoria, and Harris counties. Prior to his election to Congress, Troy served our district for nearly 30 years in law enforcement and served our country 21 years in the US Army Reserve.

At the age of 19, Troy enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve. He deployed on combat

tours to Iraq and Afghanistan, among other places. After 21 years of service, he retired with the rank of Major and as the recipient of two Bronze Star medals. Back home, Troy continued his service through law enforcement, a multigenerational tradition for his family.



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In 1994, Troy began his law enforcement service with Fort Bend ISD. He spent the next twenty-six years serving Fort Bend County in various law enforcement roles. From 2004 to 2012, he served two terms as the elected Constable for Ft. Bend County Pct. 4. After two successful terms as Constable, Troy was elected as Fort Bend County Sheriff in 2012. In 2016, Troy was re-elected and completed his second term in December 2020.

In his 8 years as Sheriff, Troy maintained his fiscal conservative principles while managing the 826

staff and \$79 million budget of the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Office. He created cutting edge recidivism reduction programs like HVAC and welding training programs for non-violent Fort Bend County jail inmates, at no cost to taxpayers, so the inmates had job ready skills when they were released. He used his position as Sheriff to advocate increased awareness of mental illness, even hosting large seminars. He even took steps to start a specialized mental health unit at the Sheriff's Office who responds to mental health calls. Most notably, in his eight years as Sheriff, burglaries were reduced 60%, aggravated assaults were reduced 27%, and robberies were reduced 31%.

Troy was officially sworn in as Congressman for Texas' 22nd District on January 3rd, 2021. Troy received his bachelor's degree from Liberty University and his master's degree from the University of Houston Downtown. He resides in Richmond with his wife, Jill, daughters, Jenna, Cambry, and Tori, and their four dogs Archer, Buddy, Boo, and Lulu. They worship at Faith United Methodist in Richmond.

CHRISTIAN QUINN

Senior Director of Government Affairs Brooks Bawden Moore

Christian Quinn is the Senior Director of Government Affairs for Brooks, Bawden, Moore, LLC. He recently completed a 24-year law enforcement career, serving as a senior leader with the Fairfax County (VA) Police Department. As a capstone to his tenure, Christian served as a Police Major and led the establishment of a new Cyber & Forensics Bureau to account for emergent trends related to digital investigative methods. Christian led units responsible for technical investigations, digital forensics, crime scene investigation, unmanned aerial systems, body

worn cameras, and biometric identification, including a regional program serving state, local and federal agencies.

A native of Massachusetts, Christian earned a BA from Stonehill College. He holds a Master of Forensic Sciences Degree from The George Washington University and a Certificate in Business Process Improvement from George Mason University. He has completed several executive development programs and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

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
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MEET THE SPEAKERS

LAURA SUDKAMP

Lab Director Kentucky State Police

Laura Sudkamp graduated from the University of Kentucky with a Bachelors Degree in Chemistry. She began work with the Kentucky State Police Forensic Laboratories as an intern in the Forensic Biology section in 1989 and then was hired as a Drug Chemist that same year. After working drug cases for 9 years, was promoted to Supervisor in 1998. Later she was promoted to the Administrative Laboratory Manager writing grants and managing the \$11 million lab purchasing for four years. In the fall of 2004, she transitioned to the Operations Laboratory Manager for the Central Laboratory Branch and also served as the System Director where she had direct oversight over the quality operations of the six KSP Laboratories. In October of 2019, she was promoted to **Director of the Forensic Services Division** for the Kentucky State Police.



Ms. Sudkamp has become active in Forensic Science activities at the national level.

- She is on her second term with the Board of Directors and the current President-Elect of the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors. She is also a member of the Midwest Crime Laboratory Directors.
- Shesits on several Boards in Kentucky covering topics from Sexual Assault

EDWARD PARKINSON Chief Executive Officer


FIRSTNET AUTHORITY

CAPTAIN DON Redmond


