

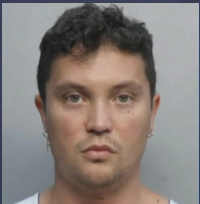


AUTOMATED LICENSE PLATE READERS

ALPR is a proven tool to help solve violent crimes, find missing children, recover stolen vehicles, and protect victims. The tool also comes with responsibility. Access must be documented. Queries must be auditable. Policies must be clear. Misuse must have consequences. We don't have to choose between public safety and accountability. We can demand both.

MYTH vs FACTS

ALPR is new and untested technology.



For two decades, ALPR has been a proven public safety tool providing critical leads when information is limited and time matters.

ALPR continuously tracks people.



ALPR captures a photo of a vehicle and publicly displayed plate at a specific place and time. It is not continuous video and does not identify a person.

People are stopped or arrested based only on an ALPR alert.



An ALPR alert is a lead, not proof of a crime. Officers verify the facts before taking enforcement action.

Using ALPR is a privacy violation, and ALPR should not be shared across jurisdictions.



Courts across the U.S. have held that ALPR use is constitutional. Crime doesn't stop at the county or state line so the data can't either. Responsible information sharing is critical to following real leads and arresting violent criminals.

Very short retention windows do not affect case outcomes.



Delete the records too early and you may delete the only lead. Serious crimes are often reported weeks or months after the crime is committed.

LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCOUNTABILITY MEASURES

● Legitimate Purpose

Use is tied to an active investigation only

● Documentation

A case number and reason are logged for every query

● Audit Trail

Access is time-stamped and reviewable after the fact.

● Controlled Access

Technology is for trained users under clear agency policy.

● Reasonable Retention

Data is only kept long enough to preserve leads

● Real Consequences

Misuse leads to discipline, termination and prosecution.
