Dear Executive Director Noland:

This letter is to indicate my intent to run for the position of Vice President for Homeland Security.

Since taking office as Sheriff in 2019, I have made it a priority to be actively involved in the Major County Sheriffs of America (MCSA). MCSA is a significant voice for law enforcement in our nation's capital and amongst our profession. Maintaining the credibility of this voice depends upon sheriffs who are willing to ensure MCSA's policy positions are informed, amplified, and advance our collective public safety mission. To that end I have put in the time and effort to make a meaningful contribution to MCSA's work, with a specific focus on homeland security-related policy issues. These contributions include the following:

- · Reinvigorating MCSA's Intelligence Commanders. In June 2021 I was appointed to chair MCSA's Intelligence Commander Committee. Following my appointment. I rebuilt the committee from the ground up, recruited new members, and worked to develop a format that would enhance information sharing on threats, crime trends, and programs.
- Creation of Locally Driven National Calls for Law Enforcement Executives. Together with our colleagues representing local law enforcement associations, I joined in the development of national calls on critical issues. Rather than being driven by federal agencies, these calls are designed with the local perspective and include useful information relevant to our needs. Examples of these debriefs include active shooters, organized retail theft, narcotics trafficking trends, and election security.
- Serving as MCSA's representative on the Criminal Intelligence Coordinating Council (CICC). As vice chair of the CICC I have made it a priority to push federal agencies to provide greater inclusion and consultation with local law enforcement. I participated as MCSA's representative at the 2022 IACP/DHS multiagency Intelligence Summit, and am chairing a subcommittee to bring forth recommendations made as a result of the discussions.
- Serving as MCSA's representative on the Lawful Access and Emerging Technology Intergovernmental Committee (LAETIC). As MCSA's LAETIC representative, I am working to address challenges associated with encryption and other technological advances that compromise law enforcement investigations.
- Serving as MCSA's representative on the Department of Homeland Security's State & Local Intelligence Council (SLIC). Regular discussion with the SLIC has 550 N. FLOWER STREET, SANTA ANA, CA 92703 | 714-647-1800

In addition to the contributions detailed above, I run my own fusion center, the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center (OCIAC), the only county-centric fusion center in the nation. The OCIAC has been named Fusion Center of the Year and its staff recognized nationally for their contributions and innovative programs that keep our nation safe. I have my own HIDTA area initiative, the Regional Narcotics Suppression Program, addressing drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) just south of the US border. We participate in Operation StoneGarden, patrolling the Pacific Ocean on behalf of our federal government to address narcotics and human trafficking along the Western coastline. I also partner with the FBI as a member of the Joint Terrorism Task Force, Regional Computer Forensics Laboratory, and the Human Trafficking Task Force. Lastly, as Sheriff of Orange County, I manage and operate my own internationally accredited crime lab, including a DNA lab, and I am the county's coroner, responsible for death investigations.

With a crisis at our southern border, rapidly emerging cyber challenges, the ongoing wave of foreign maligned influence, and a fentanyl crisis of epic proportions, now more than ever county sheriffs must have a role in determining how our nation addresses the multitude of threats facing local communities. I am seeking the position of Vice President for Homeland Security to strengthen MCSA's influence on these critical issues. I want to make clear that my vision for this position is not to be MCSA's sole voice on homeland security matters. Our membership is comprised of individuals with both depth and breadth of experience that can be called upon for the betterment of our nation's security posture. If elected to the position, I will rely on and regularly seek opportunities for our membership to participate in discussions and development of homeland security policy.

Serving my colleagues as the Vice President for Homeland Security would be a tremendous honor, but more importantly, an opportunity to advance the kind of policies we know will keep each of our counties safe. I humbly submit my name for consideration.





As the Chief Investigative Reporter at ABC News, Josh helps lead the network's coverage on a wide range of stories from breaking news to law enforcement to politics. Based at the News Division's world headquarters in New York, Josh produces, reports, researches, edits, writes and develops stories for every ABC News show as well as ABC News Radio and ABCNews.com.

Since arriving at ABC News in 2013, Josh has played a key role in some of the network's most provocative and groundbreaking reports. In 2021, Josh was the executive producer of the fivepart doc series 9/11 20 Years Later: The Longest Shadow, hosted by George Stephanopoulos, and he has led ABC News' effort to investigate the failures of law enforcement during the 2022 mass shooting at an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas.

Josh played a key role in ABC's well-received coverage of the 2014 disappearance of Malaysia Airlines flight 370. And he helped lead the network's coverage of the domesticviolence scandal that engulfed the NFL through much of 2014 and 2015.

Throughout 2014 and 2015, Josh played a lead role in ABC's coverage of policing in America, helping to coordinate the reporting on the cop stories that have come to define the era - from Ferguson, Mo., to New York City to Baltimore. In early 2015, Josh helped produce David Muir's groundbreaking piece that, for the first time, took outsiders into the NYPD's program designed to retrain the biggest police force in the country. Josh was the first reporter to identify the prison worker at the center of the incredible escape of two killers from one of New York state's most secure penitentiaries.

He was the editorial producer on the "20/20" special "Manhunt," the



authoritative story behind the June 2015 escape from that same prison, the Clinton Correctional Facility in Dannemora, and the efforts to capture Sawyer's unprecedented look inside on Rikers Island, a project that required months of preparation and eight full days of unrestricted filming behind the bars and the walls.

Josh helped lead the network's coverage of ISIS and the terror attacks that plagued both the United States and Western Europe in the last decade. He produced ABC's special projects investigating the police response to both the Pulse shooting and the earlier massacre in San Bernardino, Calif. And, after more than a year of investigation, Josh helped produce Diane Sawyer's hourlong program examining the nature of the seduction of ISIS and the radicalization crisis that plagued America for years.

Josh has been a member of the ABC News teams that have won four Emmy honors, and he has been nominated

10 times for the Emmy. Josh came to ABC News after nearly three years as the Senior Enterprise Reporter at the New York Post, where he specialized in covering politics and homeland security.

In April 2013, Josh broke the story that federal agents were about to arrest some of New York City's top politicians in a stunning scheme to rig the election for mayor. He also led The Post's coverage of the ongoing effort to convict the men accused of plotting the 9/11 attacks and reported extensively from the US military compound at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.

Before joining The Post, Josh spent 12 years on the staff at The Star-Ledger, New Jersey's largest and oldest newspaper. During his tenure at The Ledger, Josh broke some of the biggest and kill the murderers who busted out. stories ever covered by the newspaper A year later, Josh helped produce Diane and, in 2004, he led the team that won a Pulitzer Prize for breaking New York City's notorious jail complex news coverage for its reporting on the resignation of then-New Jersey Gov. Jim McGreevey.

> Josh is the co-author of The Jersey Sting, a critically acclaimed national bestseller that tells the inside story behind of the biggest political-corruption probes in American history.

Josh graduated from Long Island University's CW Post Campus in 1992 with a bachelor's degree in journalism. He was named one of New Jersey's 101 most influential people by New Jersey Monthly and the most influential journalist in the Garden State by PolitickerNJ.com. "The Fix" of Washingtonpost.com named Josh one of the best political reporters in the country. He has long been a regular contributor to television and radio news programs and has served as a awards, along with a host of other story and plot consultant for the hit CBS series "The Good Wife."

The Honorable Ronald L. Davis was nominated by President Joseph R. Biden to lead the United States Marshals Service (USMS) on April 12, 2021. The United States Senate confirmed his nomination on September 22, 2021, and Mr. Davis was sworn in as the 12th Director of the Marshals Service on September 27, 2021.

As the leader of America's oldest federal law enforcement agency, Mr. Davis leads aworkforceofover10,000 professionals, including more than 5,000 operational and administrative employees, and close to 6,000 special deputized court security officers, spanning over 500 domestic offices within the 94 judicial districts, and four foreign field offices. The USMS is responsible for federal judicial security, fugitive apprehension, witness security, asset forfeiture, and prisoner operations, and has an annual operating budget of over \$3.8 billion.

From 2013 to 2017, Mr. Davis served in the Obama Administration as the Director of the U.S. Department of

Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). In this capacity, Mr. Davis was responsible for working with the over 16,000 local. state. and tribal law enforcement agencies in the United States to advance community policing. In December 2014, President Barack Obama appointed

Mr. Davis to serve as the Executive Director of the President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing charged with developing concrete recommendations to improve community trust in the police while enhancing public safety.

Mr. Davis has served more than 28 years in law enforcement starting in 1985 with the Oakland, California, Police Department. Mr. Davis became Police Chief for the City of East Palo Alto, California, in 2005, and held that position for more than 8 years. As Police Chief, Mr. Davis worked collaboratively with the community to improve public trust, enhance organizational accountability, and dramatically reduce crime and violence in a city once named the murder capital of the United States.

Mr. Davis possesses a bachelor's degree from Southern Illinois University and has completed the Senior Executives in State and Local Government Program at Harvard University Kennedy School of Government.
